April 13, 2022: What construction industry stakeholders need to know about two federal labor laws enforced by the U.S. Department of Labor's Wage and Hour Division: A guide to avoiding common wage related violations on Davis-Bacon and Related Acts (DBRA) covered prevailing wage projects and under the Fair Labor Standards Act's (FLSA) hours worked and overtime requirements.

The passage of the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) in November 2021 creates a historic investment in our nation's aging infrastructure and is estimated to generate 800,000 jobs. Most of the construction projects funded or assisted through the BIL will be subject to Davis-Bacon and Related Acts (DBRA) prevailing wage and fringe benefits requirements.

Correctly classifying the work performed by laborers and mechanics, computing credit for bona fide fringe benefits, and properly paying registered apprentices, are just some of the complicated aspects of complying with DBRA requirements that will be discussed during the session. Several key compliance concepts under the FLSA will also be discussed including; travel time hours worked principles, regular rate principles for calculating overtime, and correctly designating employees as exempt or non-exempt.
